## Roc2Change Summit

On March 14, five high school students joined more than 400 students from over 40 local school districts for the Spring 2025 Roc2Change Student Summit on Race. The event was held at Monroe 2-Orleans BOCES in Spencerport and hosted by Brighton CSD, Leroy CSD & School of the Arts. The Roc2Change Summit is a regional, student-led summit that explores the boundaries of geography, race and life experiences, helping students become effective change agents. The theme of this spring's summit was Unity, Community, Fostering Connections.
