## SCCS 2020 Summer Camp Protocols for COVID – 19

## Prescreening

Parents/Families are asked to provide prescreening during the two weeks prior to camp and also on a daily basis on camp days. This includes:

- a. Taking and recording temperature daily.
- b. Screen for any symptoms of illness: fever of 100 degrees F or higher, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, nausea, loss of taste/smell, sore throat, vomiting.
- c. Monitor child for contact with an individual who has been diagnosed with, tested for or quarantined as a result of COVID-19.
- d. Monitor child if he/she has been to a "hot spot" such as NYC.

## Daily Camp Screening

Parents will be asked to fill out and sign a simple health screening form upon arrival every day of the camp. The questions asked are similar to the pre-screening.

All camp leaders, helpers, and campers will have temperatures taken with a no contact thermometer upon arrival at camp.

If a camper or staff member is showing signs of illness, that individual will not be permitted to attend camp. If a camper or staff member becomes ill during camp, that individual will be required to wear a face mask, then will be isolated away from others. The isolated area will be at least 10 feet from others but able to be visually monitored by staff members. Parents will be called to pick up ill children.

## Health and Safety Measures

Protocols for regular sanitizing, hand-washing, and social distancing will be reviewed with camp leaders prior to camp week for implementation during camp days.

When walking your child from car to camp, parents/families are to maintain social distancing from others. Camp sign-ins will be set up to help parents maintain social distancing. Parents are to wear masks.

Staff members and campers will be required to wash hands upon arrival, during bathroom /breaks, before snacks and lunch, after returning from outside, prior to departure, and all other times as necessary.

Equipment, tables, chairs, toys and resources will be sanitized regularly.

Item sharing such as toys, belongings, and supplies will be limited whenever possible. A 6 foot distance will be maintained between campers and staff during group activities as much as possible.

Whenever possible, activities will be conducted outside. Outdoor play equipment will be sanitized prior to use.

Camp leaders are required to wear masks/face coverings. Masks for children are optional. Staff members will follow parents' wishes for keeping masks on their children.

There will be no field trips. Short walks are permitted.

Camps will follow the State of Ohio's requirements regarding numbers of campers, that is, no more than nine campers per staff member.
