PBIS remains a required system in Ohio schools. This year, the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW) is shifting the focus from non-academic and academic supports in isolation to an integrated approach within their newly released IMTSS model.

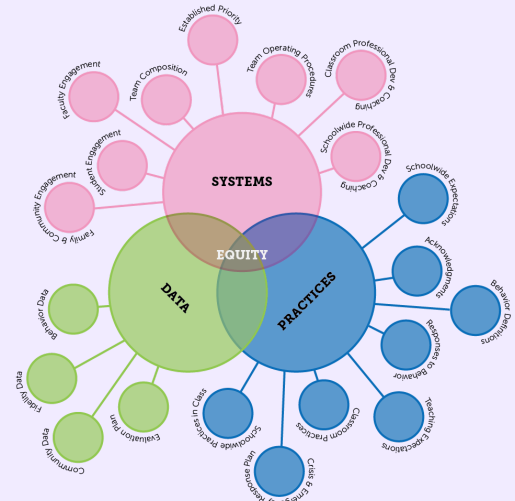


**Stay the Course:**

## Building Habits for Stronger Data Practices

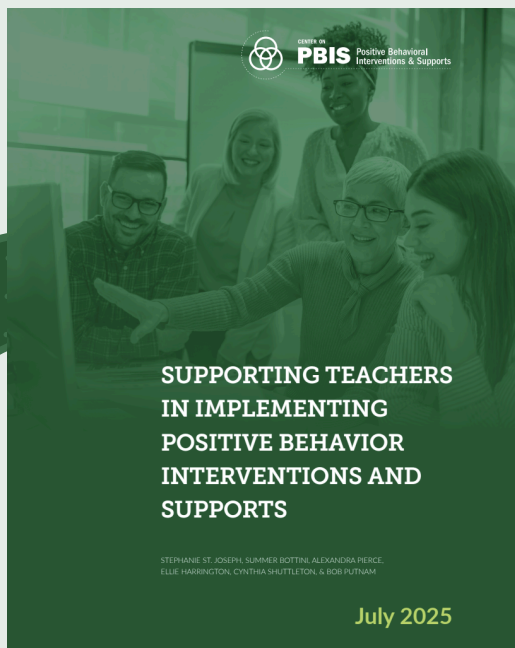
In this article, the author compares PBIS to running; when you stop practicing, you lose progress. PBIS has three key parts: **systems**, **practices**, and **data**, and while the first two are easy to see, data is what keeps everything strong over time. **Clear, consistent** data helps teams know what's working and what needs attention. It encourages schools to define behaviors clearly, look for the "why" behind them, use common responses, and partner with a data coach to keep PBIS running smoothly.
