Meetings & Committees

The Board meets in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on the second and third Thursday of each month. Meetings are held at the Administration Center for Education and broadcasted live via the District website.

In addition, the Board holds open committee meetings. Board committee meeting dates and times are listed, along with regular session dates and times, on the District calendar.

Please Note: The Board revises and adopts policies on a regular basis. Once approved, policy changes supersede those noted in the parent-student handbooks. All policies are available for review on the District website.

ELEMENTARY

Made up of grades K-6, the Elementary School level is divided into two sections.

K-4 Primary

5-6 Intermediate

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten teachers are committed to helping your child have a successful introduction to school. Through instructional curriculum techniques and programs, this grade level establishes the earliest foundation upon which we will build their education. Please contact your child's teacher if you desire more details in any area.

GRADES 1-4

Seven primary schools operate within the District. These grades function as the Primary Level. Varying in size, buildings are organized for teaching according to individual building needs. These grade levels continue to build upon the foundation established in Kindergarten through some of the most formative years of your child's education.

GRADES 5-6

The District's intermediate school program is designed to slowly grow the complexity of coursework between primary and middle school. Intermediate school students begin the transition to adding more responsibility in their education, creating the conditions for success in the rising levels of their school career.

SECONDARY

Made up of grades 7-12, the Secondary School level is divided into two sections.

7-8 Middle

9-12 High

MIDDLE SCHOOL

The District's middle school program is designed to meet the needs of students in transition from intermediate to high school. Middle school students are afforded opportunities which challenge their abilities and interests in both curricular and extracurricular offerings.

HIGH SCHOOL

The high school programs at Cedar Cliff and Red Land High Schools are committed to providing the highest quality education possible for all students. Each high school presents a variety of course offerings designed to meet individual needs while preparing students for the responsibilities they meet after graduation. The Pennsylvania Academic/Core Standards and the District's Instructional Design are the basis for course content and sequencing of programs. The curriculum is built around a core of required subjects to ensure a well-rounded education that includes career exploration and learning in specific areas of interest.

2026-2027 Meal Prices

Transportation Provider

The West Shore School District partners with Rohrer Bus to deliver safe, dependable transportation for our students.

Safe and reliable transportation is an essential component of our students' educational success. Whether it is from home-to-school or to an extracurricular activity, District families and staff depend on the daily commitment from our professional transportation team.

Bus Procedures

The District provides transportation to and from school for students based on the state approved guidelines for reimbursement. Those guidelines indicate that elementary students who live 1.5 or more miles from the school and middle and high school students who live 2 or more miles from their schools are eligible to ride District transportation. Eligible students are assigned to a specific bus and a specific bus stop.

Students are to be at their assigned bus stops at least five minutes prior to the time assigned for that stop. Rules and guidelines for riding school buses and vans are published in each building's student handbook.

Bus Schedules

The Transportation Department is dedicated to ensuring students arrive to and from school safely and on time. As an added measure to protect student privacy and safety, the District does not publish bus schedules on the District website.

In August, primary and intermediate schools will email detailed bus stop information, including stop location and pick-up/drop-off times, to parents/guardians of students in kindergarten through sixth grade.

Middle and high school parents/guardians and students will be able to access their busing information in PowerSchool at the same time schedules and class assignments are available.

Transportation Exception Requests

A District Transportation Exception form may be used to request a bus stop different from the assigned stop associated with the child's residence, provided the alternative stop is in the same school attendance area as the child's school. Such exceptions are typically requested for childcare purposes but can be requested for a different stop in the area of the child's home. A request may be filed for parents/guardians with a shared custody agreement, provided both parents/guardians must reside in the West Shore School District and live in the same school attendance area where the child or children are attending.

A completed form must be submitted directly to the Transportation Office for consideration. Such factors as length and distance of runs, number of stops on a run and consideration of the terrain and road conditions are all considered in the approval or denial of an exception request. Parents/guardians will receive a letter from the Transportation Department indicating the approval or denial of a requested change and the effective date of the change.

Screening

Parents, guardians, teachers, counselors, school psychologists, social workers, interventionists and/or others can be involved in helping to identify learners who may require Special Education Services.

To identify students who may be eligible for special education services, various screening activities are conducted according to state regulations, school policy, upon recommendation of school staff, or upon written request from the parents/guardians.

Screening activities include but are not limited to review of group-based data (cumulative records, report cards, ability and curriculum-based assessments; hearing screenings; vision screenings; occupational and physical therapy screenings; speech and language screenings). Screenings typically take place in the student's school.

Identification and Development

When screening results indicate a student may have a disability, the District will seek parent/guardian consent to conduct a Multidisciplinary Evaluation (MDE) as a step in the process of identifying a student as eligible to receive an Individualized Education Program (IEP) with appropriate support and related services.

Programs and services offered to students with a disability are based on the recommendations of a multidisciplinary evaluation and biennial or triennial reevaluation.

Following this evaluation, or reevaluation, a team of knowledgeable school personnel and parents/guardians develop individualized goals, specially designed instruction, and services. The IEP is designed to meet identified student strengths and needs and is reviewed and/or revised on an annual basis.

Educational Placement

The extent of special education programs, related services, and the location for the delivery of such services are determined by the IEP team. Recommendations are based on the student's identified needs for specially designed instruction,

chronological age, and the level of intervention.

Services are required to be provided in the least restrictive environment for the student and the student's family to select courses of study that will be meaningful to the student's future and motivate the student to complete his or her education.

Notices of Services and Programs

The Annual Public Notices of Special Education Services and Programs, Services for Gifted Students, and Services for Protected Handicapped Students can be found on the District website on the Special Education Department Page.

Confidentiality

All records regarding students are maintained with the strictest confidentiality. Parent/guardian consent, or consent of an eligible student who has reached the age of majority under state law (21), must be obtained before personally identifiable information is released, except as permitted under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Each participating agency must protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information at collection, storage, disclosure and destruction stages. One official at each participating agency must assume responsibility for ensuring the confidentiality of any personally identifiable information. Each participating agency must maintain, for public inspection, a current listing of the names and positions of those employees within the agency who have access to personally identifiable information. Parents/guardians can refer to FERPA for additional information.

Gifted Program

While providing enrichment and acceleration in tandem with a broad spectrum of educational opportunities, the Gifted Program encourages individual learners to develop personal responsibility, work cooperatively, and focus on continued improvement.

The development of critical thinking, problem solving, communication skills, and creativity is shared collaboratively among the gifted learner, parents/guardians, and West Shore School District community.

ONLINE LEARNING

What Makes ExCEL Unique?

ExCEL Virtual Learning Academy, offers quality asynchronous online learning for students in grades 7-12.

ExCEL students have access to a support network of West Shore School District teacher monitors, counselors, career coordinators, psychologists, literacy specialists, technology specialists, advisors, and administrators ready to provide assistance. They also have access to the District's special education, gifted, and social work services.

Our ExCEL students each receive a District-issued device and access to online, phone, and in-person technology support. Additionally, face-to-face support is provided when needed by District staff.

Grades 7-12

For students in grades 7-12, the option is available to take all courses virtually or to take a blending of virtual learning courses and traditional face-to-face courses in their home school.

Interested high school students also have the option to enroll in programs offered by the Cumberland Perry Area Career & Technical Center.



Virtual Learning Academy

ExCEL (**Ex**panded **C**hoices for **e**-Learners) Virtual Learning Academy is a learning option designed to meet the dynamic needs of students who are finding success learning online in a non-traditional setting.

ExCEL offers both full-time and blended virtual learning options with flexible pacing and on-site supports to help each student achieve ExCELLence in school and after graduation.

Family Support

Virtual and in-person learning opportunities for families are available to assist them in using software, navigating available resources, helping your child with organization and time management, helping to set up home work spaces, etc. Scheduled family virtual sessions are also available.

Eligibility

All students in grades 7-12 who currently reside in the West Shore School District are eligible to attend, including those students who are currently attending an outside cyber, charter, or private school. English learners and students with IEPs will meet with school staff to assess their needs and ability to thrive in a virtual learning setting.

ExCEL Teacher Monitors

ExCEL monitors understand that virtual learning is different and will adapt their practices to meet the needs of students. ExCEL monitors and staff members are available for one-on-one, small group, and office hour appointments during the school day, as well as after school hours as needed.

Students determined to be experiencing homelessness have specific rights including free school meals and consideration for remaining in the school the student was attending at the time they became homeless. Homelessness is generally defined as lacking a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence. Other conditions include:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- Living in emergency, transitional or domestic violence shelters
- Using public or private places not designed for or ordinarily used as regular sleeping accommodations for human beings, as a primary night time residence
- Living as runaway children, abandoned or forced out of homes by parents/guardians or caretakers, or separated from parents/guardians for any other reason

If a student/parent/guardian believes they meet any of these conditions, they should contact their school counselor. District staff who suspect a family meets these definitions should share information with the school counselor, building administration or District liaison, Mrs. Shannon Murphy.

Protecting Students with Disabilities

Section 504 of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) prohibits discrimination based upon disability. Section 504 is an anti-discrimination, civil rights statute that requires the needs of students with disabilities to be met as adequately as the needs of the non-disabled students.

Section 504 service agreements, also known as 504 plans, are formal documents developed to give students with disabilities the supports they need.

A 504 team determines a student's eligibility through the process of evaluation and assessment before developing and implementing a plan to meet the needs of the student.

The Annual Public Notice, Parental Safeguards Notice and Grievance Procedures related to Section 504 can be found on the District website.

TECHNOLOGY/MEDIA SERVICES

West Shore students in grades 5-12 receive a District-owned device for use at school and at home. Students in grades K-4 will have access to shared District devices for classroom learning, but devices will remain at school and will not be sent home. Students in grades 5-12 will keep their assigned device over the summer months and until they graduate, move out of the District, or the device is replaced by the District.

Support & Troubleshooting

In the event a student encounters an issue with their device, please visit the technology page on the District website for support. If unable to resolve an issue, please refer to the options below:

Hardware: In case of device hardware issues during the school year, elementary students should go to the main office and secondary students should see library staff to complete a Device Repair Form. For students attending virtually please communicate with your teacher.

Software: In case of software/classroom applications or website issues, please see the teacher of that course for assistance. In the event that a teacher cannot resolve the issue, they will submit a helpdesk ticket to receive assistance from the Technology and Media Services Department.

Damage, Loss, Theft: In the event the device is damaged or lost, it will be repaired or replaced and returned to the student. In the meantime a loaner device will be issued. If the school determines the loss or damage was caused by an intentional or negligent act, a financial obligation will be assigned to the student for the actual repair or replacement cost. Under no circumstances should the student or anyone else attempt to fix a damaged device. District personnel will oversee all repairs. For additional information, including procedures for stolen devices, please review the Parent & Student Handbook.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

District Visitor Management System

The District uses School Gate Guardian, a visitor management software program. Upon entering a building, visitors must present a valid driver's license or other state-issued identification.

The ID will be scanned and checked against the sexual offender database. Protocol is in place for those who might not have a state-issued ID.

Visitors who are authorized will receive a printed ID badge that includes their photo and name. The badge is self-expiring. Within 12 hours of receipt a red stop sign will bleed through to the front of the badge so the badge cannot be reused.

The process to scan an ID, run the check and print a badge takes about 30 seconds to complete. Frequent visitor key passes will be available at a later date for those who enter the school regularly.

Approved Online Resources

The District provides various educational content to students in digital form.

Where student accounts are necessary, the District ensures all content selected has been reviewed by District personnel and determined to be compliant with the Children's Online Protection and Privacy Act (COPPA).

The West Shore School District is committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment for all of our students, staff, and guests. The safety and welfare of our students and staff is our highest priority. While nothing is ever fail-safe, we believe the following precautions work to provide a safe environment for our students, staff, and guests:

- Exterior building doors are required to be locked during the school day. Visitors must be permitted to enter the buildings after identifying themselves and their purpose to office personnel. While this may seem inconvenient, it is essential that we know every person who enters our schools.
- All staff members are required to wear identification badges to ensure that they are easily identifiable. Visitors must also sign in at the office and wear a visitor's identification badge/sticker.
- District and building administrators are visible in schools and at extracurricular events.
- A team of teachers and administrators at each building is trained in Safe Crisis Management.
- The District conducts Risk and Vulnerability Assessments with local police departments to determine areas of needed safety improvement.
- We require staff to be vigilant in monitoring guests as they walk the halls of our buildings; staff are instructed that, in the event they observe someone without a District-authorized identification, they are to question the individual's presence and escort them back to the office.

Run, Hide, Fight

Run, Hide, Fight is an intruder response plan where staff and students assess the situation and respond using the best option based on the circumstance. As the name implies, if a violent intruder comes into a school, the response could be to run to a safe place, or hide in a locked area, or attempt to stop the intruder as a last resort with items found in the school.

The District holds drills throughout the school year which includes practicing the hide portion of Run, Hide, Fight and age-appropriate training.

School Security Personnel

In addition to School Security Guards at District secondary schools, a School Resource Officer is assigned to each high school.

School Security Personnel have undergone rigorous training in all aspects of school safety. They also serve as mentors seeking to create and maintain positive relationships with our diverse student body while actively participating in a variety of educational programs within our schools.

Volunteer Procedures

For the safety of District students and staff members, any adult wishing to volunteer is required to complete the Volunteer Application Process before being approved to do so.

More detailed information about the procedures and necessary documentation can be found in the Guidelines for Volunteers available on the District website under the Community tab.

Community Bulletin Board

The District recognizes that community organizations may want to share opportunities with students and families that are non-curricular but have social, recreational, or educational value. The District permits the distribution of informational materials that meet District guidelines.

Following approval, information may be distributed in hard copy form or electronically on our Community Bulletin Board. Additional details, including the flier request form and protocols, can be found on the District website under the Community tab.

District Voice

District Voice is an opportunity for parents/guardians and community members to share information, exchange ideas, make connections, and engage in meaningful dialogue regarding District programs, services, and initiatives. The group, comprised of selected representatives from each school and the community at-large, provides two-way communication with the Superintendent and District staff.

PTO, PAC, Booster, and Community Groups

West Shore is fortunate to have many supportive parent and community groups who volunteer their time to provide activities and support for our students.

- Crisis center reviews, assesses and processes all submissions.
- Crisis center sends all submissions to school administration and/or law enforcement for intervention.
- If needed, crisis center may contact tipster anonymously through the app.
