BUS SAFETY QUICK TIPS

Check before you step!

Know the danger zone.

"I see the driver. The driver sees me."

Wait for the driver's signal to cross.

Look left, right, and left again.

Use a backpack to avoid dropping things.

Horn means danger.




GETTING TO THE BUS STOP

- ☼ Plan to get to the bus stop at least five minutes early. Get a good night's sleep and wake up early. You do not want to be rushing around traffic trying to catch the bus!
- Always remember to pack all your items in your backpack before you leave home, so you do not drop anything on the road.
- If you need to cross the street to get to the bus stop, always stop where
 it is safe and look LEFT, RIGHT, and LEFT again before crossing.
- Always stay alert and listen for cars that you may not see.
- Never run toward the bus or run after the school bus if it has already left the bus stop.

AT THE BUS STOP

(AS THE BUS APPROACHES)



- ☆ Stay safe while waiting for the bus by staying off the street and away
 from cars. Wait for the bus on the sidewalk or grass (six feet away—
 three giant steps).
- ☼ Do not talk to strangers while waiting for the bus, and never get into a car with a stranger.
- As the bus approaches, the yellow lights change to red. **The red lights** and red stop sign on the side of the bus tell all cars to STOP.
- ☆ BE AWARE: Sometimes drivers do not respect the red lights or forget to stop like they should.
- □ BE CAREFUL: Cars could pass on both the left and right side of the bus —and from the front or back direction.
- When the bus arrives, wait for it to come to a complete stop before approaching the door.
- ☼ Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says that it's okay, before stepping onto the bus.

GETTING ON THE BUS

- ☆ Get on the bus one at a time. Form an orderly line as the bus approaches, with the first student standing at least six feet away from traffic.
- ★ Keep electronic devices packed away as you prepare to board. Never use an electronic device or wear earbuds when boarding.
- Walk slowly. Always hold the handrails as you walk up the steps.

WHILE ON THE BUS

- ☆ Pick a seat, face forward, and stay seated.
- \thickapprox Be sure to obey the bus driver's rules and directions.
- \thickapprox Talk quietly so the bus driver can focus on the road.
- ☼ Do not play, shout, or throw things while on the bus.
- ☼ Do not eat on the bus.
- ☆ If the windows are down, keep your head and arms safely inside.
- ☆ Keep your feet and backpacks out of the aisle, so no one gets hurt.
- ☆ Stay in your seat until the bus stops.
- ☆ If there is an emergency, listen to the driver and follow instructions.
 NEVER play around on the Emergency Exit door steps.



GETTING OFF THE BUS

ARRIVING AT THE START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

- ☆ Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says that it's safe, before stepping off the bus.
- ☼ When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing and backpacks don't get caught on the handrails or doors.
- ☼ Wait for your turn to get off the bus. Get in line and then patiently exit one at a time—do not push the person in front of you.
- ☆ Walk (don't run) straight toward the school.
- After you get off the bus, walk at least five giant steps away (at least 10 feet) from the side of the bus to make sure you are out of the danger zone and are using the safe walking path.
- If you drop something near the bus, do not try to pick it up. The driver may not see you. Wave your hands above your head to get the driver's attention. Wait for the driver to give you instructions.
- \thickapprox Never walk or run between parked cars and buses.

RETURNING HOME AFTER SCHOOL

- ☼ Wait until the bus stops, the door opens, and the driver says that it's safe, before stepping off the bus.
- ☼ When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing and backpacks don't get caught on the handrails or doors.
- Wait for your turn to get off the bus. Get in line and then patiently exit one at a time—do not push the person in front of you.
- Always be alert and focused when near the school bus danger zone.
- ☆ Never walk behind the bus.
- ☆ If you drop something near the bus, do not try to pick it up. The driver may not see you. Wave your hands above your head to get the driver's attention. Wait for the driver to give you instructions.
- ☆ NOTE: The driver's horn signals DANGER.

AFTER GETTING OFF THE BUS

IF YOU DON'T NEED TO CROSS THE ROAD...

After you get off the bus, walk at least five giant steps away (at least 10 feet) from the side of the bus to make sure you are out of the danger zone and are using the safe walking path.

IF YOU NEED TO CROSS THE ROAD...

- After you get off the bus, walk at least five giant steps away (at least 10 feet) from the side of the bus to make sure you are out of the danger zone and are using the safe walking path.
- ☆ "Be aware cross with care!" Wait until the school bus has stopped
 all traffic before stepping out onto the road.
- ☼ Be sure that the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver.
- ★ LISTEN carefully to the bus driver's crossing instructions.

LOADING AT SCHOOL

- ☆ Check with the bus driver or teacher to make sure you get on the right bus.
- ☼ Walk straight toward the bus door and be sure your driver can see you.
 Get on the bus one at a time.
- ☆ If you drop something near the bus, do not try to pick it up. The driver may not see you. Wave your hands above your head to get the driver's attention. Wait for the driver to give you instructions.
- Never run toward the bus or run after the school bus if it has already left the bus stop.

- 5. If you drop something, tell the bus driver. Never crawl under the bus to get something you have dropped.










How well do you know the school bus safety rules? Test your knowledge by analyzing the next illustration.






