UA Kindergarten Program

- All-day kindergarten meets the needs of our developing learners so that they are able to learn and grow academically, socially and emotionally.
- The full-day program provides more time to develop students' skills in the core academic areas while also maintaining our focus on developing the whole child through social and emotional learning and growth.

What to do to get ready for Kindergarten...

- Write and recognize your first name
- Listen to and recite nursery rhymes
- Identify most uppercase and lowercase letters in random order
- Count to 20
- Recognize numerals 1 to 10 in random order
- Follow simple instructions
- Listen to read alouds for 10 minutes



What to do to get ready for Kindergarten/school...

- Open containers and zip lock bags
- Participate in a conversation
- Readily transition to a new activity
- Play well with others most of the time
- Easily separate from parents/guardians
- Work on independence / Getting in and out of the car etc...
- Bathroom Independence / Cleanliness



Kindergarten Literacy

- Literacy is an important component that is weaved into every part of our day
- Based on the Science of Reading, we focus on foundational skills.
- We are working to ensure foundational skills are secure by the end of the K year
 - Letter ID
 - \circ Sound ID
 - Phonological Awareness
 - Letter Formation
- The curricular resources we use are Heggerty and 95% Core Phonics



Registration process



How do I register my child for Kindergarten?

- **<u>Kindergarten registration</u>** opens on Monday, February 20th, 2024, 9:00am
 - We encourage families to complete the registration process February 20th-March 20th for staffing and planning purposes.
 - Begin the registration process at <u>https://www.uaschools.org/kindergarten.aspx</u>.

After completing the online registration forms, you will be prompted to upload:

- Birth certificate or passport
- Proof of residency
- Custody papers, if applicable
- Immunization record
- Your school will reach out with more details about Kindergarten screenings this Summer.



Other items to consider...

 - Can choose their UA Schools Elementary Program or the Progressive/Informal Program at Wickliffe.
- Students must be 5 yrs old by September 30, 2024
- **School hours:** 8:15 a.m. 2:50 p.m.
- First day of school
 - August 14th and 15th, are "Getting To Know You Days" (Your child's first day will be emailed to you with teacher placement in early August).

Kindergarten screening

- Kindergarten screening is when your child is invited to come to the building, meet Greensview staff, and see the Kindergarten spaces. We will conduct games and necessary assessments to determine readiness. Also, during this time, our school nurse will be completing vision and hearing screenings and our Speech and Language Specialists will complete a speech screening.
- Our Kindergarten screenings will be held in August prior to school starting, dates TBD
- Stay tuned for more information about how to sign-up for the screening date and time.
- After the screening process in August, you will be contacted with your child's teacher placement and first day of school information.



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Instructional programs



Multiple Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS)

- MTSS is a systematic and collaborative team process that is responsive to meet the needs of all students through differentiated and individualized instruction with a focus on the whole child including academic, behavioral and social/emotional needs. MTSS uses a four-tiered approach to identifying students' academic, social and emotional needs.
- The Upper Arlington Schools' Multi Tiered System of Support (MTSS) framework will help achieve our vision of challenging and supporting every student every step of the way.

Elementary Explorations

- Elementary Explorations is a districtwide program that provides all elementary students with opportunities to engage and explore cross-curricular content, creating engaged learners through whole child, project-based learning. Each grade level engages in Elementary Explorations once every two weeks for about 60 to 75 minutes, following the rotating A-E schedule.

 - Our 4th and 5th grade classes are departmentalized and divided into two teams

 - 20+ Staff Members either had students in the UA schools or currently do!



The SACC registration process is changing for the 2023-2024 school year. **Registration for the 2023-2024 school year for ALL families** — including current SACC families, wait list and new to SACC — will be open from Monday, April 3 through Friday, April 14 via a link at www.uaschools.org/SACC.

There are a variety of other after-school programs that pick-up from Greensview. However, we are not permitted to share the names of programs, as we are not affiliated with them.





SACC (School-Age Child Care)

- The SACC program is designed to be a link between school and home for elementary students in Upper Arlington School District.
- Hours of operation are from 2:50-6:00 p.m. on school days.


• Services Offered:
